TUNDRA OIL & GAS DONATES \$5,000 TO THE VIRDEN LIONS CLUB

Winnipeg, December 11, 2015 – Tundra Oil & Gas donated \$5,000 to the Virden Lions Club on Monday after 700 batteries were stolen from the club.

The Virden Lions Club sells donated batteries in order to make donations to local charities and projects such as the hospital, auxillary and the Virden handi-van. The club has been doing this for over 21 years, and without the batteries they are unable to raise those funds.
